## Limitations of the study

- Data not available from many councils (underestimated intake)
- Transferred animals number transferred to major agencies not estimated (double counted overestimated intake) or to rescue and other small agencies, including breed-specific rescue groups (not included in data)



## Limitations of the study

- Small percentage of animals not accounted for in data provided → deceased, fostered or in system at the start or end of time period
- Trapping of feral cats may not be included in impoundment data (Brisbane City Council did not include 261 feral cats)

#### So this means...

- Lack of readily accessible data from agencies
  - No centralised data (exception of NSW)
  - Limited transparency and approachability
  - **尽** Right to Information Act







## Outcomes: Dogs versus cats

- Marked difference in documented outcomes between dogs and cats
  - More than half of cat intake (56%) euthanased compared to dogs (21%)
  - Generally outcomes better than previously quoted
  - Intake & number euthanased over time
  - no improvement for cats compared to dogs (NSW)

## Opportunities for improvement

- Variation in agency performance
  - Individual councils and welfare agencies performing above the national average while others underperforming in some areas
    - → opportunity to share successful strategies



### And...,

JUST AHEAD

- Need for transparency of council pounds and animal welfare agencies' performance
- Need for a centralised database for analysis and assessment of pound and shelter performance on a state and national level
- Need to identify agencies with effective management strategies to be acknowledged and be publicly evident so others can learn → improve outcome
